

Bibliography and Note Cards

Remember that when handwriting, titles of major works are underlined, but when you type it on your works cited page, it will be *italicized*

Number of resource in upper left corner
This is the first resource consulted/looked at

Alberts, John. How to Document. New York: Random House, 1997.

This is MLA form for a print source (book) with one author.

Number of resource in upper left corner
This is the 2nd resource consulted/looked at

Doe, Brent. "Documentation and You.." Newsweek. 26 July 1993: 24-28.

This is MLA form for a print source (periodical) with one author.

Number of resource in upper left corner
This is the 3rd resource consulted/looked at

This is MLA form for a print source (book) with two authors.

Number of resource in upper left corner
This is the 4th resource consulted/looked at
